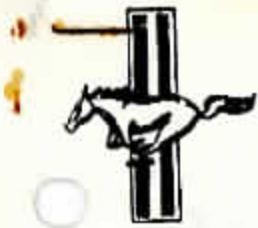

owned by Billy & Kay Beasley

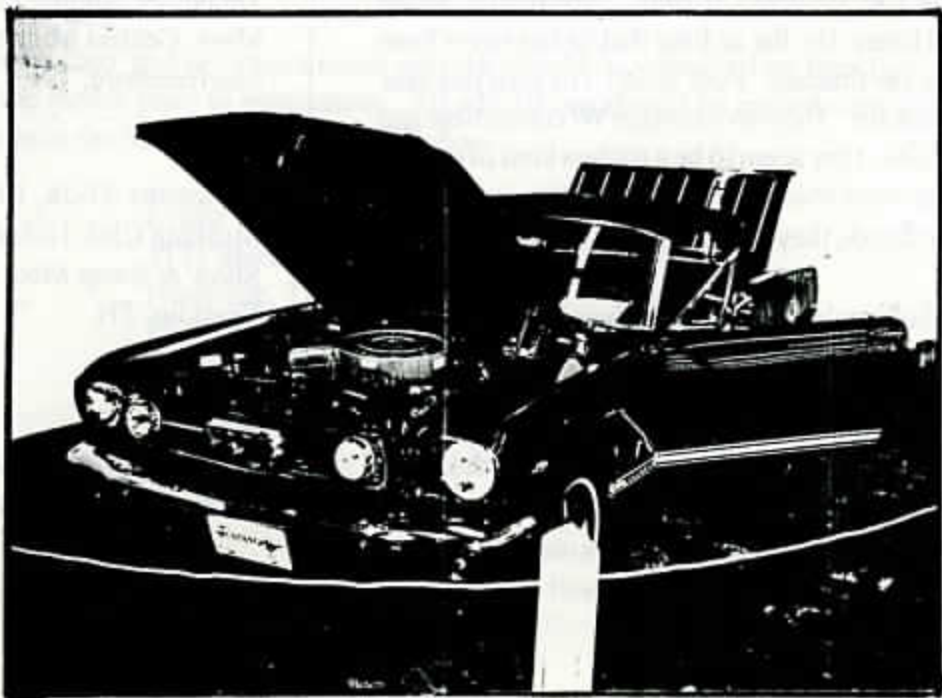

This month's pony is a beautiful candy apple red convertible owned by Billy & Kay Beasley. The A Code has an original AM-FM Radio (very rare) and matching red Pony interior.

Power Steering, Disc Brakes and Air Conditioning makes it easy to understand why Billy drives it to the shows instead of trailering.

The Pony was acquired in 1986, the same year the Beasleys became members of The Music City Mustang Club. It was not running and was brought home on a wrecker. Looking quite rusty but with no major problems, made this a choice project for Billy and his brother, Bobby Beasley, to restore.
