Pony Of The Month 1968 Shelby GT350 Owned by Gene & Kay Shields

The Shields' Shelby is another example of perfect workmanship. This month's pony is a bright candy apple red '68 Shelby GT350 with black interior and a top loader 4-speed close ratio transmission. The limited slip 31 spline rear end is unusual, as it is normally only found in the big block cars. The power-plant is a 302 250hp with cast iron intake. The ground up restoration took over two years with almost all the work being done by Gene & Kay.

The Shelby was acquired in 1988 after a long search through Moore County. Gene tracked down the owner, Terry Hart, who worked for Jack Daniels Distillery in Lynch

burg, and a deal was struck. The car was in original condition with the exception of the radio and carburetor. Gene replaced them to make the package complete.

After the restoration was finished the car's odometer was rolled back from it's 78,000 original miles and started at zero.

The extensive collection of trophies are almost all first place. The only exception is one second place (I'd like to see what it took to beat this beauty). The most cherished of the trophies is the Sponsor's Choice Awards from the 1995 SAAC-TN and 1995 Music City Mustang Shows. Another very memorable award is the First Shelby Show in Nashville, Indiana where it took Popular Choice in the GT350 class.

The Shields are original members of MCMC and can be very proud of their award winning, low number Shelby.
