The 4.6-liter SEFI V-8 pours out 215 little horses under the hood doing their work. Backed up by a 5-speed transmission, the car has a mellow rumble that is music to the ears.

Anthony is a fairly new member of Music City Mustang Club, joining just this past July when he met the club at the Nashville Speedway Show & Shine. He also has a '68 Convertible in restoration.

He basically got tired of having to MAKE his own replacement parts for the Chevy and decided to get into something he could get parts for ... enter the '67 Coupe.

Bob and Donna came to the MCMC show at Cool Springs Mall in 1994. They found the dues sooo cheap, they just had to join. They have been very active members ever since. They currently own a Laser Red '96 and a '67 Coupe.

It was valued at \$2800 back in the '70's and is worth much more today. He also makes silver jewelry. In fact, Bob designed and crafted Donna's engagement ring.

Bob was very good friends with Donna's sister, and referred to Donna as "Disco Donna". In May we had our annual Ten Pin Bowling Challenge against our Aussie Ford Falcon Club (69-71), we lost again which is nothing unusual as the score is now 2-7, but a fun night was enjoyed by our 29 bowlers. Also in May, 22 Mustangs headed 80 miles north of Sydney for a tour of the local Vineyards for wine tasting and a very good lunch at one of the larger Winerys.

In June the Club put on a static display at a Motor Show for new cars and accessories which stole the limelight from the new cars. This wasn't too hard to do as most were either Japanese or Korean and they all look the same.

July 28th was the Sydney Combined Ford Clubs 20th Annual "All Fords Day" which is by invitation only due to the size of all the competing Clubs outgrowing the venue. The Mustang Owners Club only received 52 tickets this year which is the largest amount given to any Club. The weather was very unkind in the morning with steady rain, but around midday the rain stopped and although overcast, the crowds came out in force to check out the best vintage and classic Fords in Sydney.

The following weekend August 4th, 30 Mustangs headed 200 miles South West to Canberra, our Nations Capital, for the "Canberra All Ford Day" which was the 6th Annual Show and has always been a "must do" event as the stop-over on Saturday night is again a fun time when everybody gets together and the stories and beer flow.

Wednesday August 14th, Sydney celebrated the return home of our Olympians from the Atlanta Games. Mustangs, MG's, Saab & Mercedes convertibles were used for the ticker-tape parade through Sydney streets. The newspapers put the crowd at 100,000 and the television and newspaper coverage was unbelievable. The crowds were incredible and the 65 cars in the procession were just able to move along the route cleared by the Police. This was a day I won't forget, even though I am still getting paper out from under the dash & seats.

We hope the Club has a successful Show Day at Cool Springs Galleria in September and our thoughts will be with you, as it was at this show last year that we joined Music City Mustang Club and met so many wonderful people.
