# Heart Healthy Recipes

#### ZESTY CORN CHOWDER

Submitted by Lou Sullivan This recipe is from the Saint Thomas Heart Institute Cooking Sahool

1 cup chopped onion 2/3 cup diced sweet red pepper Butter-flavored cooking spray

1 (14 1/2 oz.) can sodium-reduced chicken broth

1 cup potato, peeled and diced

3 Tbs. Flour

1 (12 oz.) can evaporated skim milk

1/4 tsp. White pepper

1 (10 oz.) package frozen whole kernel corn,

1-2 Tbs. Canned chopped green chiles, drained Fat-free shredded cheddar chesse, optional

Coat a large Dutch oven with cooking spray; place over medium heat until hot. Add onion and sweet red pepper; sauté until tender. Add chicken brothand potato. Bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes or until potato is tender. Place flour in a small bowl. Gradually add milk, stirring with a wire whisk until blended. Add milk mixture, white pepper, corn, and green chilies; stir well. Cook over medium heat about 7 minutes or until thickened, stirring constantly. Ladle into individual bowls; sprinkle with cheese if desired.
