**RED VELVET CAKE
Submitted by Lou Sullivan
(My Mother-In-Law's Recipe)**

- 1/2 cup Shortening
- 1 1/2 cups Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 oz. Red Food Coloring (1/4 cup)
- 2 Tbsp. Coca
- 1 Teaspoon salt
- 1 cup Buttermilk
- 1 Tsp. Vanilla
- 2 1/4 cups flour
- 1 Tsp. Soda
- 1 Tsp. Vinegar

Cream shortening, sugar and eggs. Make paste of food coloring and cocoa and add to mixture. Add buttermilk with salt alternately with flour and vanilla. Lastly add soda and vinegar.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cool Use 2 - 9" pans.

FROSTING

- 3 Tbsp. Flour
- 1 cup Milk
- 1 cup Sugar
- 1 Tsp. Vanilla
- 1 cup Butter

Cook flour and milk mixture until thick. Cool. Cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Add vanilla. Blend this mixture into the cooled flour and milk. Frost cake.
