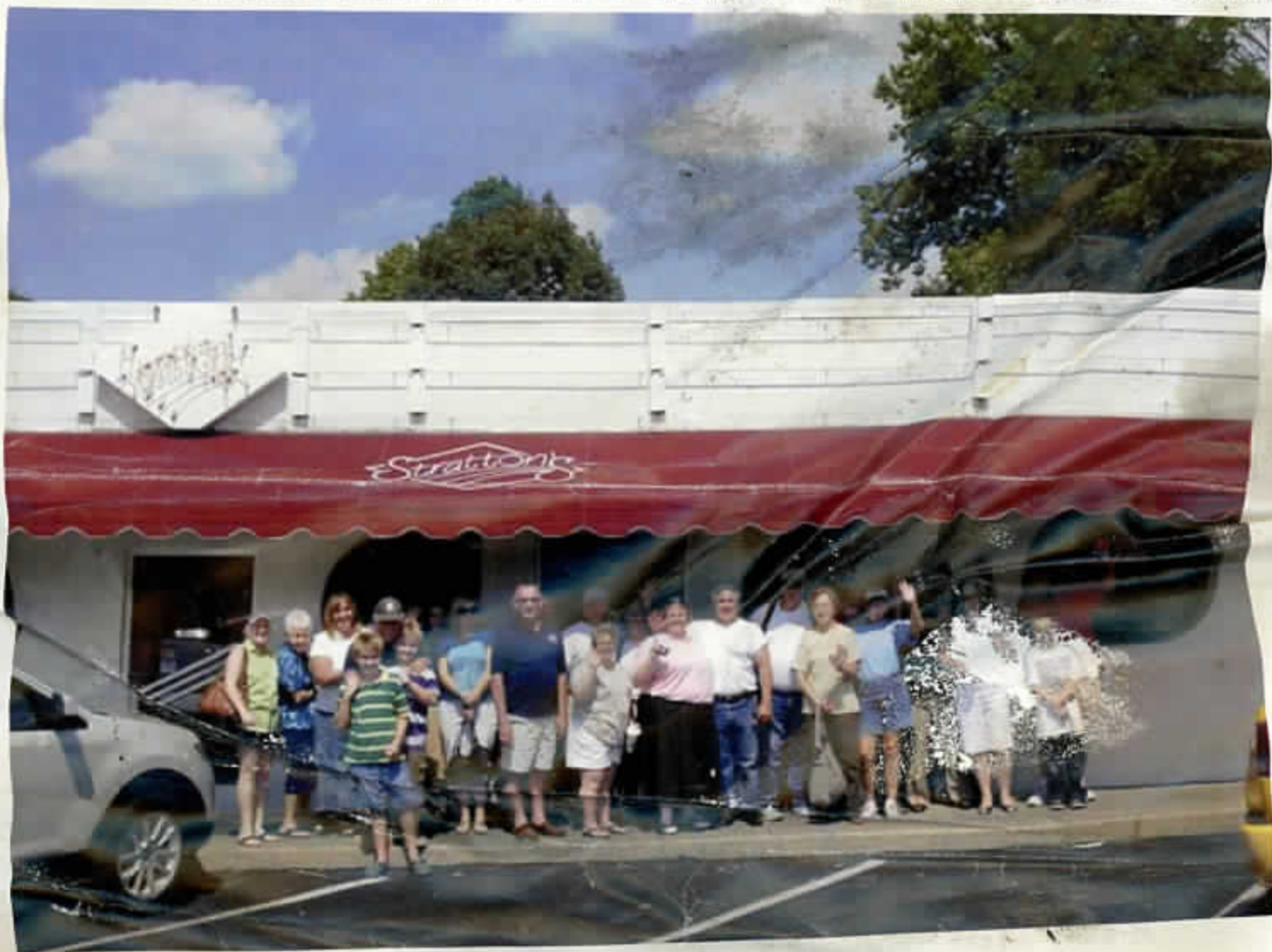

2009 Ford Mustang

The 2009 Ford Mustang will be available in seven models. A V8 models id couple and convertible. A V6 models will also be available in couple and convertible. The special editions for 2009 will be the Bullitt, California Special, Warriors in Pink, Shelby GT500 and Shelby GT500KR

The new major option for 2009 is the Glass Roof (option # 59G) and it will be available on GT and V6 Premium coupes. A new option for the GT only is a security package (option #43G) and it includes Active perimeter inclination and intrusion alarms along with a wheel lock kit.

A new color, Brilliant Clearcoat Metallic (U1) , will replace Silver Metallic. Another small change is the use of the 45th Anniversary badge on all models except Warrior In Pink models. For the first time the V6 models will have an 18" wheel option and GT models will have an 18" chromed aluminum wheel option.

The GT/CS California Specials will be available in Vapor Silver in couple and convertible. The Warriors In Pink Editions will have the color options of Performance White, Black and the new color Brilliant Silver.

The Shelby GT500 is back but without any changes. Which is probably dues to so many special editions available. Including the Shelby GT500KR with another 571 cars built.

This lighthouse was actually moved in 1999 to protect it from the eroding beach. Not a single pane of glass was broke during the move! Moving on down the island, we stopped at a wildlife refuge display and had what I thought was the best day of the trip. We climbed a sand dune and on the other side found a little slice of heaven! There was the ocean in all its glory and not a single soul around. The beach was ours for the taking! After we worked up a good thirst, we went back to the cars and cut open a watermelon that had been in the cooler all day. I do believe that was the best watermelon I have ever had! Now each night was a different hotel and only Jim knew where we were staying, so it was an added mini adventure. On the way to the hotel, we experienced a Brew thru.
