Groom's Engines Plant Tour by: jim chism

Last Wednesday, a group of us from the Club met for lunch prior to taking a guided tour of the Groom's Engines facility. We met at Logan 's Roadhouse on Elliston place. Members in attendance were Milton Scott, Dan Robbins and his brother Mark, Steve Nelson, Ray Mailloux, Karen and Ray Moore, myself, and my daughter Jordan. Lunch was fantastic, and off we went.

Henry Johs, joined us at Groom's, where we were welcomed by Doug Anderson. Doug basically ran the Groom's operation before entering into semi-retirement. He now does virtually all of their R & D on new engines and procedures as well as manufacturing techniques. His vast wealth of knowledge is overwhelming to say the least. His understanding of how the internal combustion engine works and how every action in the engine has it's opposing reaction is mind boggling to say the least.

Oh well, I continue. Doug guided us on a two hour tour of the facility starting with the receiving and disassembly area to the final assembly and run-in station. The precision and attention to fine details is beyond belief. You leave there with the sense that they actually build the engines better than the manufacturer's. They take the time to correct manufacturing and engineering flaws and make the engines perform to their maximum.

Unfortunately, no pictures will accompany this article. They have a pretty strict photo policy. I can tell you, however, that nothing was off limits during this tour, and they pointed out all of the things that they do that separates their engines from the competition.

Ask any of the tour members, I think they will all tell you that they were blown away with the tour.
